
School Finance 101: Windsor Locks Public Schools

Student Needs


 Student poverty in Windsor Locks has fluctuated over the past 10 years. Currently, 12% of Windsor Locks students are estimated to be living in poverty.¹

 Windsor Locks' percentage of low-income students has also increased 13 percentage points of the last 10 years.²


% of Windsor Locks Students w/ Free and Reduced Priced Lunch

 Windsor Public Schools currently spends more per student than most similar districts and the state average.³


2018-19 Spending Per Student



How Windsor Locks is Funded

- Taxpayers in Windsor Locks currently pay 75 cents of every dollar in the city's education budget.⁴
- Windsor Locks taxpayers contribute \$14,462 per student while the State of Connecticut contributes \$3,673.5
